The Women's Collaborative of Boulder Featuring 9to5

AAUW Boulder is part of the Women's Collaborative of Boulder County, along with other groups including Zonta and the League of Women Voters. President Marilyn Leist and Financial Officer Mary Hassler have been attending the meetings of this newly-formed group. Its purpose is to share common goals and to discuss ways that the group can work together on projects of interest. The Women's Collaborative usually meets the fourth Thursday of each month, although the dates may be changed during the holidays. For the next several newsletters, we will introduce our sister organizations.



Last month, 9to5, a member of the Women's Collaborative of Colorado, provided our speaker.

9to5 is a national organization representing office workers and women in low-pay jobs. It was started 43 years ago by a group of women who felt that they were not taken seriously. The movie 9 to 5 was based on this group, not vice-versa. The members work for inclusion of all people regardless of gender, age, race, or sexual orientation and work to improve policies in the work place. They believe all people should live above the poverty level and have financial security. 9to5 lobbies at the federal and state levels. This election season they are working to get women out to vote and are supporting wage and medical-related legislation. 9to5 Colorado is very active and is led by Executive Director Linda Meric.

Meet New Member Joanna E. Cain



Joanna Cain has been either a student, instructor/educator, or education consultant her entire adult life. Education is important to her, and she believes that girls and women should pursue an education, whether that is a vocational one where they learn a marketable skill, or an academic one that provides opportunities for independence and career growth.

After her first degree, a BA in English from Emory University, she worked in public relations for several years and, ultimately, decided that she wanted to work in a career that helped others. She then took all of the science/math prerequisites, attended nursing school, and received her BSN from Baylor University. Joanna worked as a nurse instructor in a nursing program for a few years, before deciding to start a healthcare communications company, Auctorial Pursuits, where she writes/edits/develops educational products (books, e-learning modules, test banks, etc.) geared to healthcare students. Her clients are major healthcare/medical publishers. Then in 2010, she started Global Academic Consultants, which helps students with the admissions process to boarding school, college, graduate school, and professional programs, using an online platform to assist students around the globe.

Joanna is new to AAUW. The chief academic officer of her company, who is also a PhD-prepared academic and a past AAUW member in Florida, recommended that she join AAUW. We are lucky to have her in AAUW Boulder.

Joanna has been a competitive swimmer since age 4. She attempted to swim the English Channel in 2013, and was caught in a storm that resulted in her boat crew pulling her from the water 1.5 miles from France. She has undergone two shoulder surgeries as a result of the physiological damage incurred during that swim. She hopes to be able to start swimming again in 2017.
