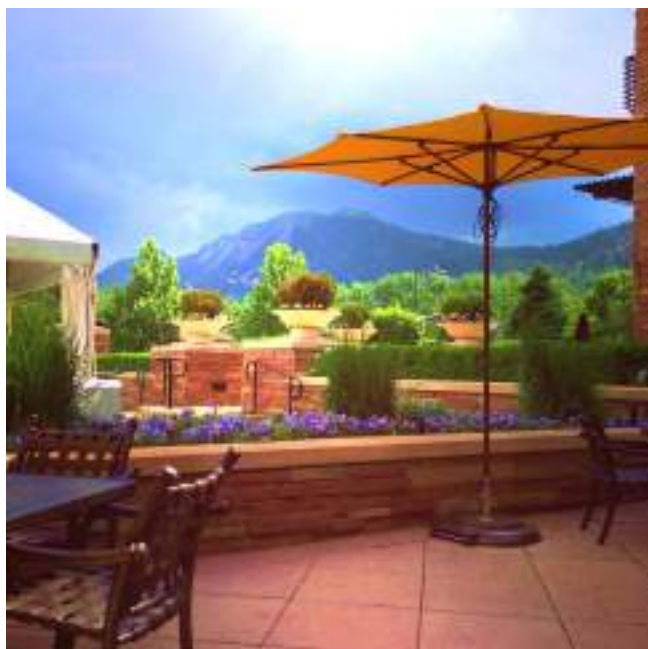

If the link is not working, go to www.aauw.org and click on the VOTE NOW button. Enter your member ID and your voter PIN (both are in your email) when prompted and then review the ballot and cast your votes.
