Proceeds from the event will fund an AAUW Work Smart Workshop (\$750) for women already in the job market. We will help them develop the skills they need to negotiate their salaries and promotions.

The gender pay gap is still_REAL!

According to AAUW's research published in *The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap* the following is true:

- Women's median annual earnings as a percentage of men's median annual earnings is 79%.
- The median annual earnings (Men-\$50,898 and Women-\$41,690) and earnings ratio for full time year-round workers in Colorado is 82%.
- After accounting for college major, occupation, economic sector, hours worked, months unemployed since graduation, GPA, type of undergraduate institution, institution selectivity, age, geographical region, and marital status there is still a 7% difference in the earnings of male and female college graduates one year after graduation. Another AAUW research study found a 12% unexplained difference in earnings among full-time workers 10 years after college graduation.
- The gender pay gap grows with age. Among workers aged 55-64 years old, women were paid only 76% of what their male peers were paid.
- The gap in pay contributes to the fact that it takes women longer to pay off student debt.
- Women face a pay gap in nearly every line of work. The largest gaps recorded are in financial management, medical scientists, lawyers, and pharmacists.
- Note: This research was published in 2014, but the gap persists...

AAUW National and the University of Colorado are still working on the AAUW Start Smart contract. I have talked to both parties and everyone wants it signed quickly. When that happens, AAUW Boulder and the Women's Resource Center at CU will offer at least three Start Smart Workshops for students each year for the next three years.

I can't believe the gender pay gap is STILL REAL! It's up to us to change the data in Boulder County.





Boulder Passes CEDAW Resolution

The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), a United Nations treaty for all women's equality. This is the only international human rights treaty that focuses on women's rights and provides a universal definition of discrimination against women so those who would discriminate based on sex can no longer claim that no clear definition exists. It also calls for action to eliminate discrimination in many areas including politics, law, employment, education, and health care.





Colorado Cities for CEDAW is a Task Force actively supported by the Business and Professional Women (BPW) and the United Nations Association (UNA). The mission of this task force is to inform city organizations about CEDAW and get city administrators to develop and sign resolutions in support of CEDAW. The cities of Louisville and Lafayette signed resolutions in 2016 and just this past week, *the city of Boulder passed their CEDAW Resolution*. Many women from the Women's Collaborative of Boulder County and other organizations attended and spoke to the council in support of the Resolution.
