Diversity, Equity, Inclusion: Engaging Members for Action is the 2019 AAUW-Colorado Public Policy Day theme. **Dr. Nita Mosby Tyler, Chief Catalyst for The Equity Project, LLC will be the featured speaker.** The day will also include a panel on **Equity in Action** and the annual **Lobby Corps Report** on 2019 Colorado legislative issues. Go to **aauw-co.aauw.net** to register online (or use the mail-in registration form on page 7 of this Bulletin) for the conference to be held at the Lakewood, Holiday Inn, 7390 West Hampden Avenue, Lakewood. **The conference cost is only \$45.00 which includes lunch. The deadline for registering is January 28, 2019 so register now** and

invite friends to join you for this most important and energizing day.

The Colorado Legislature convenes on January 9 with many new senators and representatives on board. The Colorado Legislature website has not updated the contact information for our Boulder County legislators which we had promised to have to you by January. As soon as that document is available, we will send an e-blast and put it on the website. Those attending Public Policy Day will receive the complete directory for the Colorado legislative contacts.

ONE THING YOU MUST DO FOR NATIONAL AAUW:

As we gear up for the coming year's advocacy, make sure you're ready to take action by checking that your Action Network information is up to date. Get even more opportunities for advocacy with Two-Minute Advocacy Mobile --- text "AAUW" to 21333 to receive timely, targeted alerts straight to your cell phone via text message.

Title IX at Risk (from Advocacy at AAUW): As you well know, there are few issues more central to AAUW's mission than Title IX and its promise of equity in education. Members like you were key to the passage of Title IX and AAUW continues to fight today to realize the full promise of the law. That's why each and every member needs to enlist her voice to help protect Title IX.

The Department of Education recently unveiled its *Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, (NPRM)* to amend regulations implementing Title IX of the Education Amendment of 1972. **AAUW vehemently opposes the Department of Education's proposed rule which would significantly and detrimentally impact women's and girls' ability to access education free from sexual harassment or assault.**

If you have not yet done so it is time for you to sign AAUW's petition to the Department of Education and to share it with friends, family members, and neighbors. You may also want to submit an op-ed piece to the local newspapers to draw attention and get information into the hands of community leaders and decision makers alike. **WE HAVE UNTIL MID-JANUARY TO MAKE OUR VOICES HEARD – PLEASE RESPOND NOW.**
